

Jane ran a series of inspiring workshops with the Prep School. The pupils asked some brilliant questions, and Jane shared fantastic tips alongside her own experiences of dyslexic thinking.



Jane doesn't just read from her books; her session began with an immersive, dramatic reading that encouraged some audience participation. She tackled "big" issues—from animal welfare and empathy to bullying and social media influence—with a trademark balance of depth and humour.

As a dyslexic author, Jane accurately frames dyslexia as a true gift, that allows her to utilise her creative way of thinking to bring her thoughts and stories to life. This shows pupils that her dyslexia does not hold her back, in fact it was the making of her becoming an author.

# Academic Enrichment Achievements

## ISA STEM Finals

For the third consecutive year, St Catherine's has returned victorious from the ISA STEM Final - an exceptional achievement that reflects the talent, creativity and dedication of our pupils.

This year's final, held at Crosfields School in Reading, brought together just 15 finalist schools from over 800 entrants nationwide. We are especially proud that St Catherine's had the highest number of pupils represented across three categories a testament to both the breadth and quality of our STEM provision.

Our pupils presented innovative and inspiring projects:

- Year 5 & 6: Self-Sustaining Terrarium
- Year 7-9: Thy Gyro-brush: Where Parkinson's Has No Limits
- Year 10-13: Cardio - An Irrigation System to Regreen Deserts

The pupils' success on the day was outstanding. Our Year 6 pupils received the Judges' Award for their dynamic and confident presentation. Our Year 9 team achieved an impressive second place for their thoughtful and practical Gyro-brush design, supporting patients with Parkinson's.

Most notably, our Year 12 pupils were awarded first place for their exceptional irrigation system, recognised for its innovation and real-world impact. Judges praised all of our entries for their meticulous design, ingenuity and confident delivery.
